As musicians, we will...

As scientists, we will...

Investigate the properties of everyday materials and decide which materials will be most suitable for building a pirate ship. We will investigate which materials are waterproof and which will float or sink.

As writers, we will...

Write instructions for how to be a good pirate.
Write our own non-chronological reports about pirates.
Write a recount of our own experiences.
Write a letter in a bottle to send to a pirate.

As active bees we will...

Learn about balance and have an awareness of our bodies in dance.
Learn to copy and repeat a taught dance sequence.
Begin to learn basic hockey techniques such as dribbling and passing.



As mathematicians, we will...

Recognise repeated addition and represent these with multiplication equations.
Calculate multiplication problems using the 2, 5 and 10 times tables.
Divide by sharing and grouping.
Learn the properties of 2D and 3D shapes.

As citizens, we will...

Consider how people and other living things have different needs.
Learn about the differences between needs and wants.
Learn that money needs to be looked after, and different ways of doing this.

As geographers, we will...

Name and locate the world's seven continents and five oceans.
Name, locate and identify characteristics of the four countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom.
Identify key geographical features.
