What will we be learning?

As Historians - We will be finding out about prehistory - the Stone Age, the Bronze Age and the Iron Age. We will be comparing the way people lived and the materials that they used with life and materials/technology of today. We will look at how life changed for people from the beginning of the Stone Age to the end of the Iron age. Children will learn to look at historical sources as clues about the past and will think about what they believe the best achievements of prehistoric people were.

As Geographers we will be learning about the journey of a river from its source to the sea. We will look at some of the most famous rivers in the world, find them on a world map and look at the surrounding geography.

As Scientists - We will be investigating rocks and soils. We will find out about different types of rocks and how they are formed. The children will investigate the properties of rocks and what they would be useful for. We will find out about fossils and explore the life of Mary Anning. We will also spend time this term focusing on the skills needed for Scientific Enquiry and designing experiments to practise those skills.

As Artists, we will be immersing ourselves in the world of prehistoric art, specifically The Stone Age. We will be learning about the processes involved in creating prehistoric art. As well as using simple shapes to sketch, creating large-scale copies, and experimenting with charcoal to replicate the cave artist's style. We will become experts in colour mixing with natural pigments. Over this term, we will discuss the differences between modern paint, and art equipment as well as colour choices to recreate prehistoric art features. All while exploring the rich history of prehistoric art.

As Musicians - We will be working on our singing skills by singing a variety of well known songs in French.

In PE we will be developing a range of our ball skills, we will be developing our accuracy and consistency when tracking a ball. We will explore a variety of different throwing techniques and the correct throw to select for a given situation. We will be developing our catching skills with both one and two hands as well as dribbling with both hands and feet. We will be able to work both individually and with others.

In Computing - We will learn to log in to our chrome books and to use educational sites such as TTrockstars, EdShed and Developing Experts. We will learn how to search using Google and how to access our Google classroom. We will begin to learn how to use Stop Frame Animation.

In RE, as theologists we are going to be introduced to the Religion of Judaism. We will discover where Judaism is in the world, what values and beliefs the Jewish people hold and where Jewish people worship.

In our PSHE lessons, we are learning to value ourselves and others, understand different emotions, create a safe and fair class environment, work cooperatively with peers, and make responsible choices following the Learning Charter. These lessons help us grow as individuals and responsible members of our classroom and society.

In Languages - We will be learning French phrases to tell people all about ourselves. We will learn how to say hello and ask how someone is, we will be able to say our name and age in French and ask other people what they are called and how old they are.
